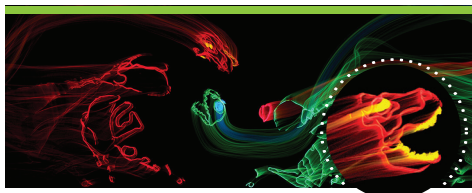


PAMYUA
